We walk by Faith and not by Sight in the Mass!

This past week I had the privilege to accompany Bishop Baker in attending the mid-year meeting of Bishops in St. Louis, Missouri. There are 270 active Bishops and 200 Retired Bishops in America and they gather together in the Summer and the Fall to be united in the ways they guide and guard all of you, the faithful.

Please pick up a Bulletin at the end of Mass and read my Pastor's Desk where I <u>point out</u> these gatherings of Bishops are an objective sign of how the Holy Spirit is preserving the Catholic Church to be <u>one</u> ... in spirit and in truth.

On my flight home Friday, I sat next to a man who in introducing himself said: *"I used to be Catholic, but ..."*

I <u>hear that a lot</u> these days! Well, he <u>went on to describe</u> that <u>he grew up</u> **Catholic** in **Pennsylvania** ... but then got a scholarship to play **Baseball** at **Birmingham Southern** ... and there <u>met his wife</u> who was **Baptist**.

Well she <u>didn't want to be</u> Catholic ... and he <u>didn't want to be</u> Baptist ... so they found a little Methodist Church and <u>have been going there</u> for their 25 years!

He's <u>not really happy with</u> **the preaching** and seeing **the attendance** go down to **40** people on Sunday <u>and falling</u> ... **but** <u>that's all he's known</u> now <u>for</u> **25 years**.

I <u>reminded him of</u> the True Presence of Jesus in the Catholic Mass and <u>invited him</u> to come with his wife to Sunday Mass sometime to participate in the worship of God the way God designed it ... through His Son Jesus ... truly present on our Altar.

I <u>also left him</u> with **an RCIA invitation** card and I <u>got</u> **his business card** so that I can <u>send him a copy</u> of **Allen Hunt's** book, "*Confessions of a Mega-Church Pastor*". It's **Allen's account** of <u>how he pastored</u> the **largest Methodist Church** in Georgia <u>until he discovered</u> that **the only Church Jesus** <u>founded</u> was **the Catholic Church**. And **Allen** <u>ends each chapter saying</u>, "*Everything you need is in this house*."

This is <u>what I mean</u> when I <u>speak of</u> "*re-evangelization*" ... <u>it's calling</u> those <u>already</u> in the Catholic family ... <u>back to</u> the practice of their Catholic faith.

The need to do this is great ... the need is everywhere.

The group called "Fallen away Catholics" <u>numbers</u> 13% of the people of America ... making them the second largest group after Catholics at 24% ... and well ahead of the third largest group, the Baptists at 5%.

Here's another example of the need for re-evangelization:

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A month ago I was waiting in the lobby for **my Dentist appointment** and **a woman came out** <u>having finished her appointment</u>, I <u>greeted</u> her and she <u>asked</u> where my **Church was.** I said **Gardendale** and **Warrior** and I asked where she went to church.

She too used those famous words, "Well, I used to be Catholic, but ... "

But ... she went a step further.

She <u>said</u>, "I used to be Catholic ... but I <u>married</u> **a previously married man** ... and **you** <u>kicked me out</u>!"

Since I was wearing my Priestly Clerics, she identified me with the Catholic Church ... and so what she meant was ... the Catholic Church kicked her out.

As you can imagine, **my first impulse** was to get **defensive** ... **but no**, I <u>decided to do</u> what **Pope Francis** guides us to do ... refrain from dropping the **Atom Bomb** ... and <u>simply meet people</u> where they are.

So I asked her, "Well, where are you going to Church now?"

She <u>explained</u> that she <u>originally went with</u> her husband to the **Baptist Church** but the **preaching** there <u>didn't resonate with her</u> ... **so now she** <u>wasn't going anywhere</u>!

I said the Catholic Church is <u>committed to upholding</u> the teachings of Jesus ... <u>including</u> His teachings about <u>the permanence of</u> the Covenant Bond of Marriage.

<u>And I said</u>, "If you'll <u>approach the Church</u> with your husband's case, there <u>may be a way</u> to have his first marriage annulled, so that <u>your marriage could be blessed</u> in the Church ... and <u>you could come back</u> to the Sacramental life of the Church!"

She was <u>so pleased to hear this</u>. I <u>asked</u> if she knew any Priests in Birmingham and she mentioned **Fr. Alex Steinmiller**, the Principal of Cristo Rey High School. I <u>encouraged her</u> to give him a call and **she** <u>thanked me</u> and **I** <u>got the impression</u> as she left that <u>she would indeed call him</u> to see what's possible!

This is **re-evangelization**! This is <u>calling</u> **Catholics** <u>back to</u> **the Church**.

You can do it too.

In fact it's your Baptismal Duty to do this ... everywhere. ... every day!

Why do you think these people stop going to Mass?

I suspect that it's this.

They know ... that when they <u>marry outside</u> the Catholic Church ... regardless of whether their spouse was previously married or not ... they <u>place themselves</u> outside the sacraments ... which means they <u>can no longer go</u> to Communion or Confession.

And <u>knowing</u> this, **they** <u>say to themselves</u>, *"If I can't go to Communion ... then why go at all!"*

What they've actually done ... is reduce the Mass to the reception of Communion!

Is that true?

Is Mass simply the opportunity to come here to receive Jesus in the Eucharist?

No!

The Mass is way more than just being able to receive Holy Communion.

As we said last week on the Feast of Corpus Christi ...

Mass is the re-presentation of the Redemptive Mystery of Jesus Christ... that brings infinite glory to the Father ... and untold graces upon us!

The grace of hearing the word of God proclaimed

The grace of hearing the word of God_preached ... broken open for your life today The grace of having your intentions and your very self_placed in the paten and offered to the Father alongside the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist in the Eucharistic Prayer ... the greatest most powerful prayer in the world. The grace of receiving the Final Blessing of Almighty God at the end of Mass.

Each time people pray the Mass they receive grace!

Consider:

- all the children who attend Mass before they receive their First Communion.
- all **the RCIA Catechumens and Candidates** who <u>attend</u> **Mass** <u>before</u> they are **Baptized** and **Confirmed**.
- all the millions of people in **hospitals**, **nursing homes**, **prisons**, the **homebound** <u>who watch</u> the **Mass on TV** because they're <u>unable to physically attend</u>.

None of them <u>are receiving</u> Holy Communion ... and yet ... all <u>are receiving</u> great Graces <u>from praying</u> this <u>most powerful prayer</u> ... the Mass!

You know, many <u>uninformed</u> Catholics <u>look at</u> not being able to receive Communion as a Penalty. Like the woman who said, "You kicked me out." ____ She's feeling penalized!

Well, <u>it's a self-inflicted</u> **penalty** ... that <u>doesn't have to last forever</u> ... there is a way back.

Withholding **Holy Communion** from **those** <u>not validly married in the Church</u> is <u>simply stating</u> that **something** is preventing you from **full union** <u>at this time</u>.

Like a person that falls into Mortal Sin (such as missing Sunday Mass) they've broken their union with God and the Church ... and that has to be addressed in Confession before they can return to receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion that manifests union with Jesus and His Church.

But Mortal Sin and unblessed Marriages should never keep a person from Mass!

That's like saying, "Well, I'm so sick that I don't think I'll go to the Doctor."

It's those times that we are very sick that we especially need to see the Doctor.

And Jesus, the Divine Physician, the Doctor of the Soul, is present at every Mass!

How do we see Him?

Paul tells us today, saying, "We walk by faith and not by sight."

If Mass to us is just about what we see with our eyes, then we'll be unwilling to go when we can't receive Communion.

At least the Communion gives us a visible manifestation of His presence.

But Jesus is present regardless of whether or not you receive Him in communion ... and He's doing great work and we're receiving great graces in his presence!

Given that I've already talked about <u>what happened in</u> a Dentist's office ... I'd <u>like you to consider</u> this analogy.

Many Dentists <u>reward</u> their Patients with a brand new Toothbrush at the end of their visit.

It's a nice surprise and we typically take it home and use it to care for our teeth over the next 6 months until our next check-up.

Well, what if for some reason your Dentist stopped giving you a Toothbrush at the end of each visit ... would you stop going to the Dentist?

If you do, then you're saying that the Toothbrush was everything to you ... and all the other things that happened ...

during your Dental exam and treatment ... meant nothing!

This would mean that all the drilling that took place to remove decay ... all the filling of holes to build up a tooth ... all the polishing of surfaces to make them white ... would be considered as unimportant.

Is that true?

Is your Dental visit <u>all about</u> the Toothbrush <u>or</u> is the work accomplished there of great value to your oral health?

You bet it is!

Your regular semi-annual visits to the Dentist ... preserve you from developing serious problems that require crowns and bridges later on.

The Toothbrush you receive at the end is an additional blessing that's meant to be a valuable tool to help you preserve your dental health until the next visit.

It's the same way with the Mass ... there's a lot happening there too!

And to turn away from your weekly visit to the Divine Physician ... just because you can't receive Communion ... is to deny yourself all the purifying and building up and polishing that Jesus wants to do to your soul!

What's there at Mass ... <u>nothing less than</u> the Power and Presence of Jesus! It's <u>more than</u> a Holy Meal ... it's <u>participating in</u> the Mystery and Majesty of God!

<u>Receiving</u> Jesus in Holy Communion is <u>an additional</u> Grace ... over and above the the infinite value of the Mass ...

Holy Communion is the supernatural "toothbrush" that helps you preserve your spiritual health ... until your next Sunday visit.

Yes, the Mass is way more than just Holy Communion! There's never a reason to miss Mass ... even when you can't receive Communion.
