"From the Pastor's Desk"

In the war of 1812, Great Britain attempted to regain control over the United States and on September 14, 1814, the British Royal Fleet proved their prowess in a spectacular and useless display of military power by pummeling Fort McHenry in Baltimore harbor with cannon bombs.

The Americans did not return fire. But they did hang a red, white and blue flag out. At dawn — much to everyone's surprise — the British had not breached the fort's walls and the flag was still there.

An eye-witness to this, Francis Scott Key, decided to write a patriotic song. He fitted his words to a popular English drinking club song called, "To Anacreon in Heaven."

In the now-forgotten final stanza, Key wrote:

*Then conquer we must when our cause it is just
And this be our motto: "In God is our Trust."*

*And the Star-Spangled Banner in triumph shall wave
O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave."*

Key's name spread throughout the United States because of the popularity of "*the Star Spangled Banner*" as it was sung everywhere, though it would not formally be adopted as **the national anthem** of the United States for another century.

Well, here we are today ... just 200 after the penning of that song and the question is ... are we still the land of the free and the home of the brave?

We may not have a foreign enemy bombarding us with cannons ... but our freedom is being threatened just the same.

What freedom am I referring to? Our **freedom of religion** ... that is being threatened not from outside but from within.

Yes, our political culture is losing patience with the inconvenient truths of the Catholic faith and so there is a movement to narrowly redefine *religious freedom* and reduce it to *merely freedom of worship* ... saying in effect ... "*OK, y'all are free to do whatever you want inside your churches ... but don't dare bring your beliefs out in the open and into the public square!*"

See this for what it is ... an attack on our Religious Freedom ... something we're assured of by our Constitution.

This is in direct opposition to what **Saint John Paul II** declared in 1996, saying "*The most fundamental human freedom is that of practicing one's faith openly, which for human beings is their reason for living.*"

In order for us to remain "*the land of the free*" we must all witness that we are "the home of the brave"!

So, pray and bravely stand up for our Religious freedom!
