Thought for the day
 Can you imagine the worst things you've ever done, tied to a heavy rock and thrown into the depths of the sea? All traces of our sins would disappear forever into the deepest recesses of the ocean, to be forgotten and never called to mind again. What a healing, and peaceful thing it is to be forgiven, both by God and by those whom we have hurt. If we have ever been given this gift of forgiveness by someone that we have hurt, we should remember that, and give this same gift to someone who has hurt us as well.

The prodigal son's father understood the processes his son would go through. He let him do it and did not try to control his actions. That is the amazing part! That was one smart father. The father allowed the son to learn his lesson the hard way, and if he returned to him one day, then it was because he came to his senses and realized he loved his father after all. Children must be protected and guided but it is a good thing to allow them to make some of their own mistakes, especially if they learn from them.

The most prevalent way that many people view the parable of the prodigal son is through the eyes of our Father in heaven. God gave us freewill. He respects us and allows us to choose our own path in life, even when it is the wrong thing to do. God does not try to control us the way that most parents do with their children. Free will is a two edged sword and we can make fatal choices, choices that harm us, but God does not protect us from our errors. God doesn't force anyone to remain with Him, or force them to love Him. Forgiveness is an act of God's grace. Love is a gift freely given. So is forgiveness.
